Dear participant in the Youth Exchange "ANTYGONE today: Tools for empowering young people subjected to discrimination and marginalisation",

We are glad to welcome you in Athens. With this info pack we aspire to give you the right information in order to facilitate your travel and stay, help you prepare and make you feel safe about your participation in the Programme.

About the "ANTYGONE"

The "ANTYGONE Today: Tools for empowering young people subjected to discrimination and marginalisation" is a European mobility project. It is a follow-up of several older projects and foresees one Youth Exchange in Athens, Greece (23 April – 02 May 2023).

The youth exchange follows similar methodology based on the use and study of classical ancient drama as a tool for identification of problems and discovering space for solidarity and reflection on contemporary European problems. Starting from Sophocle's Antigone, participants will be introduced to various theatre and improvisation techniques, body movements and a series of non-formal learning activities, in order to widen their horizons and get acquainted with their own feelings and emotions better.

The project involves:

8 organisations from 8 countries: Bulgaria, Greece, France, Portugal, Romania, Italy, Hungary and North Macedonia.

Objectives

Promoting intercultural dialogue through non-formal education to the benefit of young people's wellbeing, future mobility and career perspectives;

Stimulating youth organisations' openness and, ultimately, youth work in Europe through capacity building in the field of media and communication;

Strengthening youngsters' participatory attitude and competences, while exploring intercultural relations and new socio-political perspectives;

Promoting the culture of tolerance and non-violence;

Acquisition of new skills by participants with the aim of using and spreading them further.

Practical Information about the Youth Exchange

1. Dates

The **Youth Exchange in Greece** will take place from **23 April** (arrival day) until **02 May** (departure day) **2023.** Partner organizations, teams and participants are responsible for the arrangement of their travel and will be reimbursed based on the European Commission Distance Calculator (see next page).

2. Accommodation

The whole team will be hosted in 2 different accommodation places:

- **23 - 27 April, Scout training center** outside of Athens in small houses of 3.

Participants will need to <u>bring their own sheets, towels and</u> <u>blanket/sleeping bag</u>. There are also blankets that could be provided by the accommodation.

The accommodation is really close to the beach. If you are adventurous enough you might want to have a swim. Don't forget your bathing costume © You might need it!

- 27 April – 2 May – a Hostel in the centre of Athens: ATHENS HAWKS Hostel in shared dorms.



Meals

Breakfast, lunch and dinner will be provided by Inter Alia (except in cases of free time), taking into consideration the special food needs noted in the participants form. Please, make sure ALL organisations and participants send us the participants form well in advance to be in the position to arrange details in the best way possible.

In case you have any other need in terms of diet, please let us know as soon as possible by e-mail!



Transport from the Airport to the Venue

Participants are kindly requested to arrive at <u>Athens International Airport before 19.00 on 23 April 2023</u>. The meeting point will be at the airport, at the Arrivals floor. Look for the <u>Inter Alia sign</u>. A private bus will collect all participants and bring them to the accommodation.

3. Reimbursement Information

Travel reimbursements will be managed by the coordinator of this project, the Municipality of Haskovo.

In order to get your reimbursement, please pay attention to the following procedure:

- Keep all the tickets you get in order to prove your expenses (bus tickets, train tickets, electronic flight tickets, travel agency reservations etc.)
- Keep all your flight **boarding passes** (round-trip flights)

If you check-in on-line for the return, please print the return boarding passes also. If not, please keep the return boarding passes and send them to us after the return in your country.

We cannot reimburse you if we do not receive the details and proofs of your expenses.

During the youth exchange we will ask you to provide hard copies, please bring them with you:

- All tickets, receipts and flight reservations that prove the amount you have spent;
- Round-trip flight boarding passes
- IBAN (number of your bank account) and the name of the account holder;
- Photocopy of your ID card or passport.

The reimbursement will be done only after having received all the boarding passes and train/bus tickets (outbound and return journey). In case you do not have the return tickets, once back home, please send us the original tickets and the boarding passes of your return journey at:

The approved maximum amounts for the travel costs are as follows. This means that your travel cost will be reimbursed based on real costs up to the respective amount per country. **Full participation** to the youth exchange activities is required for getting the reimbursement.

4. Preparation Activities

The working method is based on the **active participation & learning** of participants promoted through non-formal and informal learning activities. This means that you will learn from each other, using your different experience and skills and expressing freely your thoughts and opinions.

English is the main language of the TC. However, we don't want to discourage you if you feel that your level of English is not high enough. The staff of the project will do their best to support you, while different methods will be applied in order to facilitate the integration of all participants.



Read the ANTIGONE play by Sophocles in advance, before coming to the Youth Exchange. It takes not more than 1 hour to read it and can be found in every library.

Bringing the right clothes

First of all, please, bring comfortable clothes and shoes for all activities and above all for the rehearsals.

For the performance please, <u>ALL PARTICIPANTS bring a BLUE t-shirt</u> (not a dark one, but a light blue one). In addition, if you envision Antigone as a role – bring a white t-shirt. If you envision Creont – bring a black t-shirt.





For the activities and the free time:

You are quite lucky because in Greece the sun is almost always shining, but it doesn't mean that it won't be raining at some time.

The weather in Athens in April is already quite warm (around 20°C) and during the night a little bit lower, at 11°C. In any case, we advise you to bring some warm clothes with you in order to avoid feeling cold at any time. Whatever the case, you will know in advance how the weather will look like before you start your trip, if you visit this website, which has a really accurate forecast: http://meteo.gr/meteoplus/cf-En.cfm?city_id=12.

Put in your handbag the most important stuff

In order to avoid serious problems related to loss of bags during your travel, we kindly suggest you to put in your handbag all the important stuff, especially medicine you might need, important documents (ID OR PASSPORT above all) or anything you can't do without. Please make sure to keep your ID/passport on you all the time!!!

Health Insurance

Please make sure to arrange your travel and health insurance (EU health card) before traveling!

Money and Currency in Greece

Greece's monetary unit is the Euro. No other currency is accepted and it is best to exchange your currency before traveling or at a bank. At the airport near the luggage pickup you can find machines that can exchange foreign currency and return Euro. You may also withdraw Euro's from the numerous ATM machines (that can easily be found in any place in Athens).

Keep in mind that at the first accommodation however, it is not easy to find an ATM.

Paying by credit/debit card is acceptable at most but not all stores.

Do not forget about the intercultural evening!

You are welcome to bring traditional food and drinks for the international evening. You could prepare also a song, a dance, a movie or a game from your country! Finally, bring materials (flyers, posters, etc) about your organizations. ©
